#### Superintendent's Message

On November 20, nearly 160 delegates from the Iowa Association of School Boards (IASB) and area education agency (AEA) boards gathered for the annual Delegate Assembly to conduct important business, including nominating candidates for open positions on the IASB Board of Directors and setting the legislative platform for the upcoming year.

Delegates approved key beliefs, resolutions, and a public policy agenda for the 2025 legislative session. At the heart of the agenda is the commitment to improving student achievement and ensuring the success of lowa's public schools.

"Our resolutions reflect the collective voice of school boards, directly aligned with the needs and success of students," said IASB Board President Elizabeth Brennan. "Our legislative platform outlines the policies we believe will best support the growth and success of all students across lowa's public schools."

The following belief statements are central to the newly adopted Success for All Students Public Policy Agenda:

- We believe that literacy is the building block for student achievement and student success.
- We believe that a high-quality teacher workforce is necessary for student achievement.
- We believe that expanded opportunities through public schools will provide students with diverse and engaging educational experiences.
- We believe that student, educator, and staff mental health needs must be addressed and supported to improve student achievement, reduce dropout rates, and maintain a highquality workforce.
- lowa school boards are elected by our communities to oversee public schools. Working
  closely with parents, communities, and educators, our locally elected school boards are in
  the best position to determine the needs of their communities and students.
- We believe schools must be open and welcoming to all students, and fully accountable and transparent to receive taxpayer dollars.
- We believe supplemental state aid is a critical component in student success by providing districts with adequate general fund resources.
- We believe that every student deserves to learn, and every staff member deserves to work, in a safe and secure environment.

"This year, we are focusing on securing full funding for preschool programs serving students in poverty, as early learning is critical to the long-term success of low-income students," said IASB Board President Elizabeth Brennan. "Additionally, ensuring a high-quality teacher workforce is essential to student achievement, which is why we are advocating for initiatives to recruit and retain talented educators in every lowa school district."

The Delegate Assembly serves as a vital link between IASB members and legislative issues. The process allows each school board to propose legislative priorities and then vote on the final platform. Every board appoints a delegate to represent their views at the assembly.

"Over 300 school boards submitted legislative priorities during the annual call for priorities process," said Brennan. "This grassroots approach ensures that our platform truly reflects the needs and priorities of school boards from across the state."

#### Veteran's Day Celebrations


Elementary students celebrated Veterans Day, honoring veterans with a variety of in class projects.

### Message from Principal Carlson

The school year is moving right along at the 7-12 building, and we are getting closer to the end of the first semester. Students are in their 2nd Quarter classes at this time, and winter sports/activities have begun. The building window graphics have been finalized, and they look great and provide an added layer of safety. Thank you to everyone who helped make that possible.

#### **Academics**

As stated in the introduction, students are in 2nd quarter classes currently at our building. In the coming weeks, students will begin to look at their second semester schedules and look to add/change classes that they are currently listed in for the second semester.

Our current change of advisory to the end of the day has overall been a positive change in most circumstances. The way it is set up, it incentivizes having grades up for older students, while also allowing students opportunities for reassessments and support if needed as well. We will continue to collect data on this from staff, but overall the change seems to be a positive from years past.

#### **Activities**

The winter sports are underway. There are 18 boys out for JH wrestling and 14 girls out for JH basketball, which are good numbers. We always want to see more kids participate, but the winter sports have solid numbers at the JH level right now. Our high school winter sports begin contests the last week of November, and 1st week of December so they are now underway.

The high school dance team performs in Des Moines at the state dance competition Thursday, December 5th. They will be performing in Hip Hop Class 2, Lyrical Class 1, and Poms Class 3. This is at the Wells Fargo Arena in Des Moines. Their Hip Hop routine is at 10:21 AM Thursday, Lyrical is at 11:48 AM, and Pom is at 2:38 PM. Best of luck Knights!


Between cheerleading, dance, basketball and wrestling, our students have many opportunities to be involved in throughout the winter. I look forward to watching them compete this winter!

We will use test scores to see where we are doing well, and where we need to continue to focus more on.

#### **News From the Elementary Librarians**

Both Lowden and Mechanicsville Elementary Schools are implementing creative initiatives to promote literacy and foster a love for reading among students.





At Lowden Elementary, Miss Rouse, a former first-grade teacher, has returned as the school librarian and reading interventionist. She introduced the Book-It reading program, which rewards students who meet monthly reading goals with free personal pan pizzas from Pizza Hut. Recognizing that accessing Pizza Hut could be a challenge for some families, Mrs. Rouse collaborated with the school's Food Services to provide special snacks as immediate rewards, ensuring that all students feel motivated and celebrated. The program also includes additional incentives, such as small prizes for the top reader in each class and an extra recess for the class with the highest percentage of participants. In October, 64 students earned reading certificates, and the first grade had the highest participation rate, with 73% of students meeting their goals. Boyd Schroeder was honored as the top reader, logging an impressive 1,335 minutes of reading.

Similarly, Mechanicsville Elementary's librarian Miss Schroeder has embraced the Book-It program to encourage students to read either a specific number of books or minutes each month. Students who achieve their reading goals receive special treats, certificates, and the chance to win a book of their choice to add to the library. For students in grades 3–6, the program includes a classroom challenge, with the winning grade selecting a new book series for the library. In October, the fifth grade won this competition and chose a series to enrich the library collection.



Both schools celebrate student achievements through assemblies and prizes, creating an engaging and supportive environment where reading is both rewarding and fun.

#### Miss Eichinger's 4th Grade

Miss Eichinger's 4th-graders have been working hard on multiplying bigger numbers in math. They are also a few minutes away from their November goal of 10,000 reading minutes. They have enjoyed rollerskating in PE and working on stop-motion projects in art. They have started singing their winter concert songs and are looking forward to their performance!



- Anyone 14 or older living in the home has an Iowa Abuse Registry record check and a criminal history check
- Providers need six hours of continuing education during

## Child Care Home:

- Not regulated by the lowa Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) (may be called an unregistered provider)
- Does not have a signed Child Care Assistance (CCA) Provider
